- 1) Str. w-nw winds Upper Deserts
- 2) Wind felt, still for N. Deserts - gusts from W-NW to 55 mph w/ blowing dust + sand.
- 3) High (NW) wind warning for Tehachas - 45-55 mph @ Saucberg evening
- 4) Strong ridge of high pressure over SoCal w/ med-strong off shore flow  
Record April High temp downtown L.A.: 100° - Hottest So early in year on record  
LAX 99° Monrovia San Gabriel 80°; Thermal 102°; Long Beach 101°
- 5) Wkly Santa Ana winds but still very hot all the way to the coast.  
Record Maxs for April at LACC 105°, LAX 101°, Long Beach 105°  
Ontario 109 (valid 2) Low @ LACC of 71° - Highest low ever for April. LACC still 88 @ 2100, 84 @ 2200
- 6) Wk Thermal trough along coast and high pressure over Ar. Basin. Upper level ridge over W. Coast still.  
Record Highs for April @ LACC 106, LAX 102; Long Beach 105  
Cable 108; Chats 106; El Toro 112 hottest in nation  
At 2200 LACC 82, LAX 83, PSP 80° L.A. Low 73°
- 7) Laguna Pl 90° @ 0700, 98° @ 0900  
Strong W. Coast ridge beginning to weaken, and Thermal trough shifting into desert areas for an on-shore flow.  
LACC 100°; Chats 106, Phoenix 104 - hottest April day ever.
- 21) Wk frontal passage, strong SW winds Owens + Death Valleys
- 23) Upper Low near Ca/Ore border moving slowly SSE.
- 25) Heavy showers North SFV, Simi Valley, + Santa Clarita Valley around noon - 1 pm. -  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$ " rain, some small hail, street flooding, and a little lightning
