- 3) Upper High beginning to slowly rebuild over 4-corners again  
dry SW flow aloft continues over SoCal, monsoon moisture over  
E. AZ. M.L. expected to lower a bit next day or two as  
air aloft warms and becomes more southerly
- 8) FF Watch Upper Deserts & Owens Valley  
Upper High over AZ bldg slightly & shifting eastward  
abit into NM.
- 9) FF Watch issued for DV + most of deserts & mtns of SoCal  
until 3 AM. - FF Warning for C. Riverside County -  
Near Desert Hot Springs - including Severe T Storm Warning  
for that area.
- Update @ 10 PM FF Warning until 12 mt for C. Riverside Cty -  
Coachella Valley including PSP, Des. Hot Spgs - due to  
intense, slow moving T Storm. PSP Police report flooding  
@ 10 pm PSP AP had light T Shower w/ 1 in. of rain.
- 10) FF Watch all deserts - Flooding Ojancha area & Benton area.  
Upper flow drying slightly over L.A. as it turns a bit  
from SSE to SSW
- 14) 591 Upper High over N. Baja
- 22) Another Upper trough dropping down along West Coast  
with surface low developing over Gr. Basin tomorrow.
- 26) At 0800, Hurr. KIKO in Gulf of Calif. just  
East of Cabo San Lucas, slowly moving NW,  
expected to move N. of Lopez into Pac. Ocean  
Sustained winds 80 knots. Kiko quickly formed yesterday  
into a trop. storm
