3) Quasi-stationary upper low still off of N. Baja, swinging showers into Coastal SoCal from the West. heavier rain in Conejo Valley than here.

6) Cold Upper trough over West Coast

7) Cold Upper trough over West Coast with a couple of disturbances moving through SoCal today with light snow flurries in many parts of SFU - no accumulations. Wk squall line from North mid-aft w/ mod showers. Whitened Santa Susannes down to Simi freeway.

7th + 8th: LACC 35°

10) High winds developing as wk cold front passes thru from NW

11) 1040 mb high 300 mi W of N. Cal. w/ ridge into Nevada

1011 mb low over New Mexico

High wind warning for mtns + below canyons - gusts as high as

70 mph. (70 mph @ Ontario, 80 mph @ El Toro late evening)

Laguna Reale @ 0100, Pan. 12th: 51° NE 54 10-75

Pt. Mugu 54°, NE 18

25) Wind advisory for tonight + next 2 days for mtns + canyon areas for strong NE winds as high surface pressure builds over Gr. Basin and upper low over Baja remains stationary. Record Low Dew Point recorded here @ 2100 - 54½° F dry bulb, 38° wet bulb. Dew Point -14° F, RH 5% - wind NE 5-15

30) Record Cold in Alaska last few days - with unseasonal lows down to -80 F. This evening a record high B.P. of 31.63 (1071 mb) was set in Northway, Alaska. Arctic air mass is moving into Montana this evening. - Calgary had high in mid 50s - and was -15 F by midnight. Temp. dropped more than 40 degrees at Cut Bank in 2 h from about 45 to 5 F. 31) Record BP - 31.85 @ Fairbanks
