- 4) Quite a bit of Alt convection around SFU, but nothing big. Some bigges Ludlow area
- 5) Sw Tstorm SW of Baker late afternoon - - tops visible from here!
- 1) Hurricane Linda a Category 5 storm with winds of 150  
16.9 N 109.3 W 410 mi S of Cabo S. Lucas moving  
NW 7 - late evening data
- 2) Hurr. Linda winds 185 mph (160 kts, gusts to 190 kts  
89m) ~~11~~ - 330 mi S of Cabo S. Lucas moving NW 9  
18.0 N 110.6 W (just SE of Socorro)  
Linda now the most powerful hurricane on  
record in the E. Pacific!
- 3) 4pm) Linda @ 19N 111W, moving NW @ 8kts  
Category 5 Super Hurricane with sustained winds  
of 160 knots, gusts to 190 knots or  
185 mph, gusts to 220 mph  
300 mi SSW of tip of Baja.
- 4) 8pm) Linda @ 19.6N 112.3W 160 kts (185 mph)  
275 mi SSW of Southern tip of Baja  
est. central pressure is 900 mb (26.58")  
still moving NW @ 10 mph.
- 5) Linda curving to the left and heading WNW  
& weakening by afternoon.
- 6) Linda continuing WNW & weakening - winds 85 mph  
by 8pm. - about 670 mi SSW of SFU
